### **OFFICE HOUSEKEEPING**

- All animals being entered in Limousin Society Sales must be resident in the vendor's herd for the 6 consecutive months prior to the sale date.
- All animals being entered in Limousin Society Sales must be Genotyped and results back prior to Sale Entry.
- For the integrity of the Herdbook, and to safeguard breeders, from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2019 **all 1<sup>st</sup> time calvers must be Parentage Verified** at the owner's expense before the calf can be registered.
- Pedigree Females bought into your herd need to have Pedigree Certificates submitted to the Office for transfer into new owner's name to avoid Pedigree Certificates for Calves being held up in Transfer not Paid. There is a €45 charge for this. There is no charge for Female Transfers for all females purchased at Irish Limousin Cattle Society Sales.

### SALES SUMMARY

Following is a summary of the Society's sales over the last three years. The first premier sale in Roscrea this year saw the highest average and clearance % at a Society sale.

Sometimes breeders draw conclusions after "the last sale", however, from the data below, there does not seem to be any patterns. Take for example the first sale in 2024 and third sale in 2023.

One comment that I constantly hear at sales is that "stars are selling". Whether one has confidence in the "tars and underlying data or not, a high percentage of our buyers are still following them when purchasing. I wonder will this change in 2025?

### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

It is an honour once again to address you as president of the ILCS. 2024 has been a very busy year for the Council. I'll share a brief outline of some of the activities we have undertaken.

### Stakeholder meetings

The new Council's term started with the changes to the algorithm for generating the indexes in November 2023. Regardless of the pressure from many groups, ICBF have not been for changing.

There has been an increase in the number of meetings this year including the Stakeholder Forums and extra Pedigree Breeders Council meetings. At least one and often two Council representatives attended all of these meetings.

### Generating Value for your money

We have tried to focus on reducing costs of non-value add activities, while at the same time providing value to our breeders and customers. Given the losses over the previous two years, our joint treasurers John and Pat looked for opportunities to reduce costs, while not impacting the quality of service. You will see the impact of their approach in the accounts (covered later).

### Training

Eleven Council members attended online ICOS training provided by TJ Flanagan. This covered governance amongst other topics. TJ gave a great overview of board members obligations and responsibilities. A key insight was "ignorance is no defence when it comes to director's duties".

Ten Council members attended Health & Safety training given by Jim Dockery at Roscrea Mart.

### **Operating Rule Book**

An Operating Rule Book was established in March and is currently being compiled to ensure the Society has one document containing all it's rules. Many of the rule changes currently reside in Council meeting minutes or newsletters, and while it is taking a little longer than anticipated, when completed, we intend to publish it on the website so all members can access it.

We reinstated an Action List tracker. To date Council have completed 82 actions, 18 are ongoing and 14 overdue.

The **Online sales entry** is now in operation. Feedback is very positive.

**Notification of heavy birth weights** can now be made via email to <u>birthweight@irishlimousin.com</u>. This will ensure the breeder and the office both have a record of the notification. Any calf intended to be fed heavily for the show ring or to be fostered on a dairy cow should also be notified.

The **Short Gestation program** was reestablished and renamed Dairy Beef Program. Meetings have taken place with Dovea, Eurogene and Progressive/Munster Bovine. Thanks to the Short gestation team of James Wycherley, Michael Philips, Brendan Curtin, Pat Sheahan, Michael McInerney and a special mention to Frank Buckley for his advice, expertise and invaluable support.

Limo Leader transitioned to **IML HealthPlus+** (which covers all breeds). Due to this the Society no longer need to submit a separate set of accounts for it.

We started working more closely with Tully via Niall Kilrane. A **huge positive** for the breed is how well Limousin is scoring in their **Methane Emissions per Breed** research. Limousin has lower emissions that all other breeds.

**Herd Inspections** are currently taking place on behalf of the Society These are vital to maintain the integrity of the herd book.

Overall, we had a **positive sales season**. Our sales Team, consisting of Michael Phillips, Michael McInerney and John O'Reilly, worked closely with all stakeholders to endeavour to make the sales a success for the breeders and buyers. **Export on the day** for Premier Sales was a big positive.

We reestablished **surveying buyers at sales**. Bull bonuses were stopped mainly based on feedback from buyers, (while not being financially sustainable).

We stopped paper advertising in NI and UK newspapers but have maintained **advertising in the British Yearbook**. For Premier Sales we are **emailing the contacts** in our database (over 100) a link to the catalogue, details re transport and lairage and a contact name and number for assistance.

Tullamore saw a **successful National show**, with exhibitor numbers up on previous years. Thanks to all the exhibitors and everyone who made the show a success, congratulations to all the prize winners.

We have started **liaising with British Limousin Society** and we hope to grow this relationship. On the YMA front, we have spoken with our counterparts in the UK who are interested in reinstating the Anglo-Irish event. We are also in contact with the **French AI companies**.

### Marketing

We **increased** our **Social Media engagement**. We also modernised the adverts both on paper and online. We have updated the content on the website, the next step is a facelift to improve the design. I would like to thank our **PRO Ann Curtin** for both the **volume** and **quality** of content and the **timeliness** of same.

We have **increased our communication to breeders** via newsletters and ongoing emails. Our aim is to providing information that breeders are interested in. A special word of thanks to Brendan Curtin for all his work compiling the newsletters and other communications.

We have compiled a list of farms to profile in 2025.

### **UPCOMING ITEMS**

The Society plans to run several **webinars** (and record them) starting in January. The initial focus will be on **Irish and French AI companies,** followed by **animal health and nutrition**. If you have any ideas for topics, please inform your Council rep. If you wish to join these webinars, please **ensure** the **Society office has your email address**.

The Pedigree Breeders Council (group representing all breeds) are defining a **Performance Recording System** which will potentially replace WHPR. Limousin representatives are leading this.

### **Breed Secretary**

The process of **recruiting a Breed Secretary is ongoing**. We had hoped to have a Breed Secretary in place by now. We fully realise we cannot continue without one, however, it is very difficult to find someone with the required skill sets on the salary we can afford. Careful consideration is required to get the right person to fill the role and given the falling revenue and the need to monitor costs we need to **think outside the box**, as one would do in any business. We continue looking at aspects of the Breed Secretary role and how to define what best serves the membership.

We **explored the possibility of renting out office space** to generate extra income, however, due to tax, this was not an attractive option.

I would like to thank our office staff Veronica, Marie and Creina for their support during the year.

Finally, on behalf of all Council and our office staff, I would like to wish you a very happy and peaceful Christmas and all the best for your 2025 sales and breeding season.

### AGM UPDATE

The AGM took place on Saturday November 16<sup>th</sup> at the Tullamore Court hotel. Seventy-seven breeders signed in.

The AGM lasted just over two hours. Many people commented that it was good to "have a normal AGM again", other feedback was that Council are working as a team and breeders were glad that the AGM lasted a reasonable amount of time!

The main point raised was not having a Breed Secretary. While the Society definitely needs a Breed Secretary, Council will need to think "outside the box" given costs are increasing while the Society's income continues to decrease.

The following motion was raised by the NW club "The Irish Limousin Cattle Society cease publishing ICBF figures in the Sale Catalogue". Very diverse views were expressed on the night.

The article on last week's Farmers Journal made concerning reading.

- Reduction of 50,000 suckler cows in the last 12 months
- This equates to a reduction of ~60 suckler farmers per week.
- The suckler herd now stands at 799,000, the lowest figure since the early 90's.

As a Society we must be **customer focused**. If someone chooses to ignore the ICBF figures, they are fully entitled too, and can ignore this information on the catalogue, however, if we do not publish the ICBF data, the customers who do not want to ignore it will not be supported. We fully realise that very few people would stand over the accuracy of the figures given their variation in the last 12 months.

Given one of our main markets is rapidly declining, we need to target our marketing at **all** potential customers, whether this be farmers trying to breed the next Carrick champion, or a dairy farmer looking for a short gestation, easy calving Limousin bull, or a suckler farmers selling weanlings or finishing cattle.

Given the trends outlined above, Limousin needs to continue gaining market share from other breeds.

### Accounts

John O'Connell from Stephens Cooke & Associates Auditor and Accounting firm presented the accounts. The comments made from the floor were very positive especially relating to the reduction in expenditure.

### **SUMMARY**

2023 delivered a loss of €86,713.

2024 delivered a profit of €83,970, a turnaround of €170,683. This is a very positive outcome given a decrease in income of €94,203.

#### Income:

Income decreased from €553,373 to €459,170, a decrease of €94,203 (17%). The main contributors to the reduction in income were:

- a reduction of €45,730 in income relating to the 50th anniversary.
- a reduction of €37,972 (11.5%) relating to calf registrations.
- a reduction of €7,618 (56.4%) relating to Semen Royalty admin fee.
- a reduction of €4745 (5.6%) relating to membership.
- a reduction of €3,910 (17%) for embryo births.

Excluding the income relating to the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, income decreased by €48,473 or 8.8% (compared to the previous year).

### Expenditure

Expenditure decreased from &640,108 to &375,656, a decrease of &264,452 (41%).

Excluding the costs in 2023 for the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary and the consultancy services relating to the interim CEO (€147,292 in total), the 2023 expenditure would have been €492,816. Based on this the reduction of spend in 2024 is €117,160 or a reduction of 23.8%.

The main contributors to the cost reduction are:

Our **online sales entry form** was used for the Roscrea sale in October and the Athenry sale in December. Feedback is very positive, and we would recommend all breeders to at least try it. If your entry is accepted, you will receive a message on screen stating: "**Animal saved into catalogue**". You will also receive a confirmation text immediately (if ICBF have your mobile number on their database).

To access the online Sales Entry form, select the **Sales tab** on the website.

The vendor enters the animal's **tag number**. If the tag number is valid the animal's **Name** and **Sex** appears.

Select the Herd Health Scheme you are participating in. The system defaults to **IML HealthPlus+** (previously known as Limo Leader).

Sellers can enter an optional comment.

### Select Add Animal.

If your entry is accepted, you will receive a message confirming same on screen and receive a confirmation text. If your entry is not accepted, you will receive a message on screen as to the reason why.

All animals being entered in Limousin Society Sales **must be Genotyped** and results back **prior** to Sale Entry. Following are some relevant dates.

This is the first Limousin bull ever to achieve this milestone. Gestation length is a key metric for dairy farmers, one of the few growing areas in agriculture. Short gestation bulls are the key to growing our market share in the dairy market. Congratulations to Sarah on this achievement.

Many of the dams and sires were Limousin, it is great to see this market growing each year.



## METHANE EMISSIONS – Limousin the Greenest breed

Limousin are outperforming the other beef breeds when it comes to lower methane emissions.

From the research currently taking place in Tully, out of 319 bulls in the test sample of which 57 are limousin.

- 19 out of the lowest 20 are Limousin.
- 49 of the 57 Limousin are in the bottom 100.

Greenhouse gas emissions are not currently included in the indexes. From a Limousin perspective, the sooner this data is included the better. Given the growing emphasis on sustainability and carbon footprint, this is an extremely positive outcome for Limousin in the medium to long term.
